Pushin' 40!

For many years, being 39 was seen as the last year of youth, and the ensuing year began the start of a grind towards slowing down and doing less. Society no longer feels that way – now it's "life begins at 40, 50, etc." So, although the CJO is now 39, our recent, vibrant years only point to an increased impact that we are having in our Northeast Ohio communities.



As an attendee to one of our Season Series Concerts, you are experiencing our best known activity. Over the years, the CJO has presented jazz's finest performers, innovators and writers. And at every Season Series Concert, you'll hear original arrangements and compositions created for and by the CJO, especially from our gifted and award-winning Artistic Director, Paul Ferguson. These singular, sonic moments are then rendered at a world-class level by our region's finest musicians, ensuring that you'll hear **"the best jazz you've ever heard, and the best jazz you've never heard."**

But, we are doing so much more than this!

Did you know that:

- * **A residency program with Cleveland Metropolitan School District Middle Schools** is now in its fourth year and has more than doubled in size! This instruction is both impactful and unique – **we know of no other instance of a jazz organization instructing students of this age bracket.** Depending on the school, the student and the collaborating CMSD teacher, our CJO instructors guide these students from beginning on their horns to learning about jazz and publicly improvising.
- * **Our instrument donation program has now taken in over seven dozen instruments.** These donated instruments are cleaned, refurbished, and all the necessities are provided before we give these to students or schools in need. Donors receive a free pair of tickets to a CJO concert.
- * **We give away dozens of free student tickets to each Season Series Concert.**
- * **We provide funding for CJO musicians to work with students as guest artists, clinicians and adjudicators.**
- * Throughout our region, as **"CJO in the City,"** CJO groups of all sizes perform for nonprofit benefits, private events, and in parks, clubs and theaters.

The ONLY reason we have been able to conduct all of these important cultural and educational activities has been through the support of so many donors and grantors through our first 39 years. It is this generosity that enables the CJO to thrive – we welcome you to help us share even more with our region.

Notes on Tonight's Program:

Richard Bona fits within how Duke Ellington described John Coltrane – “Beyond Category,” an astounding, charismatic and unique musician. Richard’s music is sort of a musical ping pong – from Africa (specifically Cameroon), influenced by music in the US, then back to Africa for more seasoning – bits of the deep past, bits of the present from both continents. An enthralling brew indeed!



Luckily for us, Richard has been doing some big band work in the last several years and we are able to draw upon the superb arranging work of Michael Mossman, a guest with CJO five years ago.

We open with my arrangement of “African Skies,” created in honor of Michael Brecker in the year of his passing (2007). Brad Wagner and Aidan Plank offer new works and continue our tradition of presenting the latest in Cleveland Jazz Composition.

As such, CJO is committed to modeling diversity and inclusion in the arts and to fostering and maintaining an inclusive environment with equitable treatment for all.

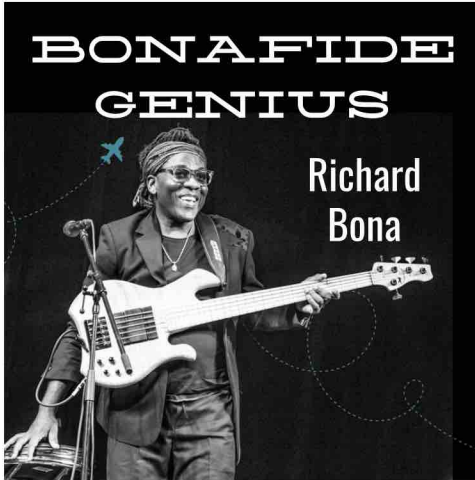
We strive to:

Cameroon-born composer, vocalist, and multi-instrumentalist, Richard Bona closes our 39th season with new big band versions of his eclectic and universal material.

RICHARD BONA

Richard Bona is a Grammy-winning musician, one of the most accomplished international bass players, composers and multi-instrumentalists. With his unique sound and vocal gift he is continuously representing his African origins. Bona's music addresses the continent's traditions, culture, beauty and issues. His purpose, and the way he connects with his audience has turned him into a staple name in world, jazz and Afropop music.

Richard Bona has toured, composed, recorded, and created musical forms of art with the greatest: Herbie Hancock, Harry Belafonte, Steps Ahead, Quincy Jones, Chick Corea, Buena Vista Social Club, Cesária Évora, Sting, Mike Stern, Pat Metheny, Stevie Wonder, Bobby McFerrin, Chucho Valdés, George Benson, Oumou Sangaré and many more. Along with the diverse notable collaborations, Richard has also taught Jazz Improvisation at NYU and is constantly teaching and mentoring young talents throughout the world. He's also a TED speaker and ambassador for various non-profit projects.

He is highly involved in developing better music business practices and ethics. His Signature Series collaboration with Italian-based MARKBASS has positioned him as one of the most creative and best-selling bass amp and bass guitar tailor-made manufacturers in the world.

Constantly touring around the world and exploring new musical directions, Richard continues to redefine his sound, while still performing live. He's currently working on new Afrobeats, Afropop, Latin and Flamenco projects throughout Europe, the US and Latin America.

Most of CJO's performers are also master educators who work regularly with students of all ages, including collegiate groups (Kent State University, Cleveland State University, Youngstown State University, Case Western Reserve University, The University of Akron, The Ohio State University and Cuyahoga Community College) and younger students (Cleveland Heights Public Schools, Garfield Heights Public Schools, Hawken Schools, Cleveland Metropolitan School District). Still others are involved in educational programs from the retail side of the music business at local music stores and via Jupiter Wind Instruments and the Selmer-Bach Corporation.

The Sustaining Pedal



For 40 years, the CJO has brought enriching cultural experiences to our region's stages and classrooms. Our Season Series Concerts, featuring amazing world class guest artists, are a sonic focal point of CJO's performing efforts, but, as with every other nonprofit organization in our region, they are conducted at a loss. To ensure that we can continue to swing and serve for decades to come, the CJO is launching **The Sustaining Pedal** – a way to help our longtime supporters explore different methods to support the CJO beyond an annual donation:

Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)

Each year, an IRA owner age 70 ½ or over can exclude from gross income up to \$100,000 of direct charitable distributions from his or her IRA. For a married couple, if both spouses are age 70 ½ or over and both have IRAs, each spouse can exclude up to \$100,000 for a total of up to \$200,000 per year. The QCD option is available regardless of whether the eligible IRA owner itemizes deductions on Schedule A, and can satisfy the donor's required minimum distributions (RMDs). Transferred amounts are not taxable, and no deduction is available for the transfer. Individuals over the age of 73 are required to take RMDs from their IRAs, and giving to a nonprofit like the CJO is an excellent way to lessen a tax burden that may come with this new income.

Charitable Gift Annuity

A charitable gift annuity may be funded with cash, securities, life insurance or a variety of other assets. Charitable gift annuities function basically like any life annuity. The donor contracts with a charity to pay a lump sum, and, in return, receives a regular income stream, which is usually paid quarterly. The payments stop upon the annuitant's death, and the remaining assets in the account are retained by the charity or nonprofit as a gift.

Bequests

A number of longtime CJO supporters have remembered the CJO in significant ways in their wills, funding our lead alto saxophone and bass chairs, and providing funding for special performing projects, including the Chas Baker CD Live Recording Concert at the Bop Stop. By naming the CJO in your will, you can create an everlasting legacy and keep the music alive in Northeast Ohio for future generations.

Keeping jazz alive in Northeast Ohio!
